The apostles and the Virgin Mary joined together in prayer between the Ascension and Pentecost, waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

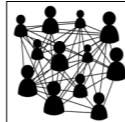

FROM THE FATHERS

For Their Sakes, I Sanctify Myself

Christ Offers Himself Or His Disciples As A Sacrifice. What does he mean by "I sanctify myself"? He means, "I offer to you a sacrifice." Now all sacrifices are called "holy". But those that are specially called "holy" are reserved for God. In [Old Testament times], sanctification was typologically indicated by the sheep. But now it is not in type but in truth itself. Therefore he says, "That they may be sanctified in your truth." For I both dedicate them to you and make them an offering." He says this either because the disciples' Head was being made so, or because they too would be sacrificed. For it says elsewhere, "Present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy," and "We were counted as sheep for the slaughter." And he makes them a sacrifice and offering apart from death. For it is clear from what follows that he was alluding to his own sacrifice when he said, "I sanctify."
