The Latin word for "Maundy" is "*Mandatum*", which means **mandate** or **command**. On this day, the Church celebrates the institution of the Eucharist and the ordained priesthood.

Easter Triduum



The summit of the Liturgical Year is the **Easter Triduum**: from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

These are the three most solemn days of the liturgical year; **Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil**. In these days, the Church celebrates the Paschal Mystery: first, the Passion and death of the Lord Jesus, followed by his resurrection, the triumph of the Holy Cross, and Christ's decisive victory over sin and death.

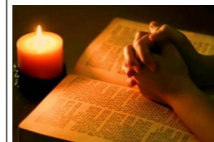
GIFT AID AND PLANNED- GIVING ENVELOPES
